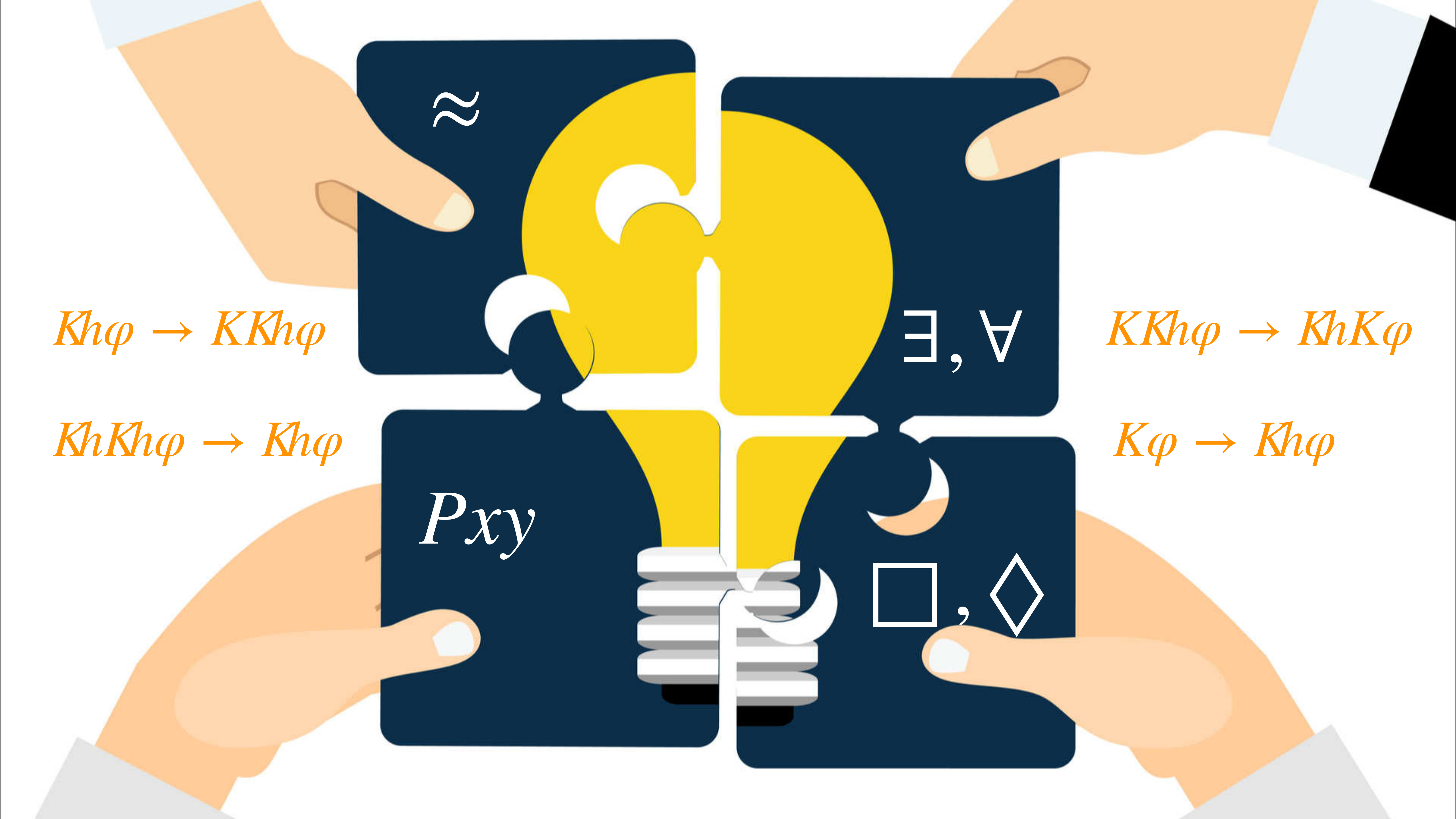

Typical difficulties

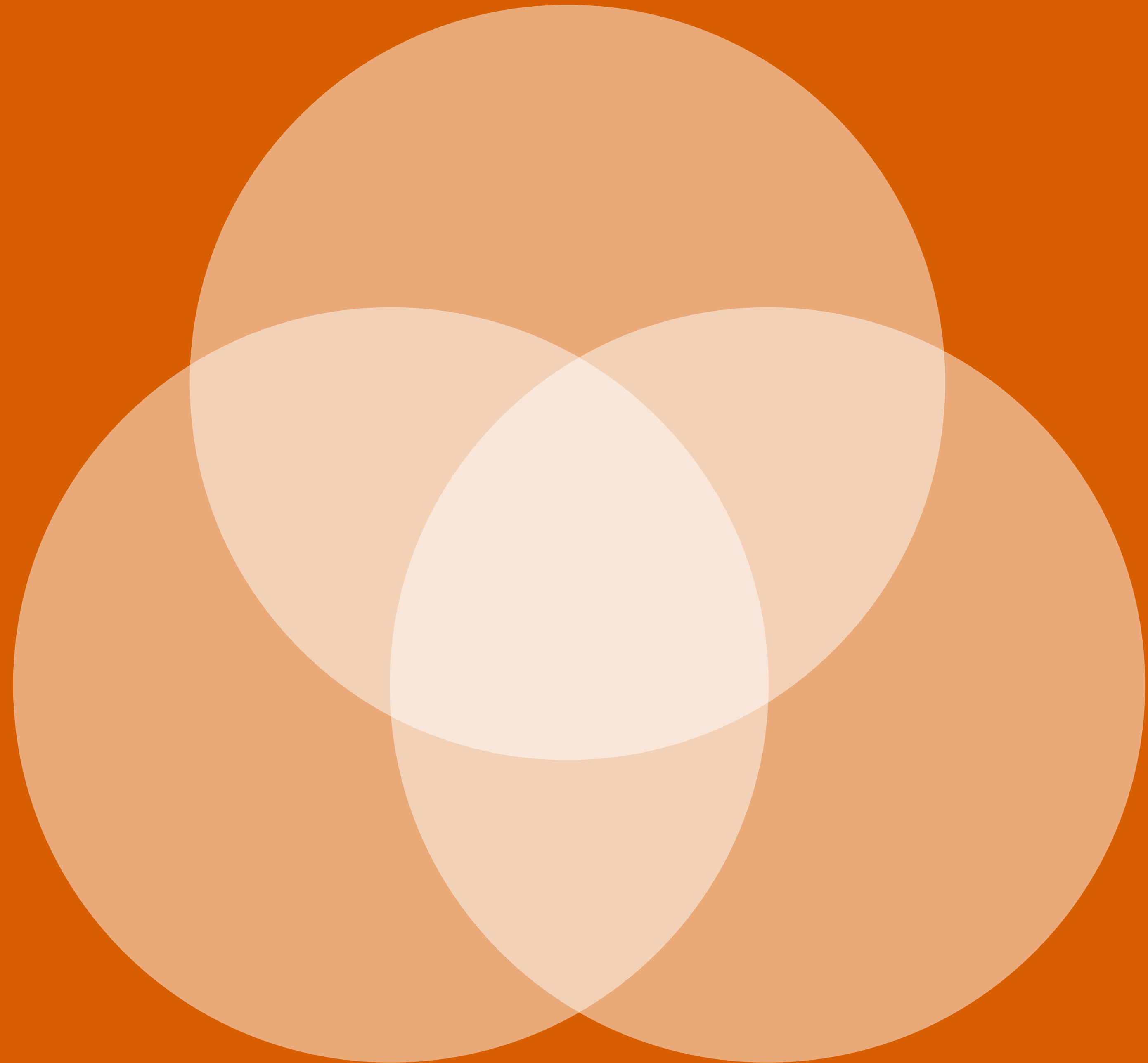
